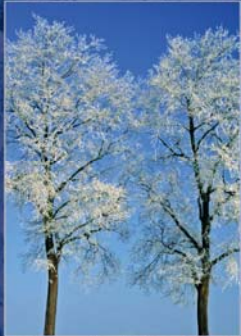

We have been involved in the past year providing gifts for the children of prisoners through our CJAMM ministries. We help sponsor camps for children of those incarcerated. We believe that if we make disciples of those that are reclaiming their lives, the world will be transformed.

We are also involved with Redemption Church. Redemption Church is "is a fellowship of prisoners, ex-prisoners, their families, and friends of faith. We seek to mold prison formed faith into the walk of discipleship. The mission of Redemption Church is to cultivate and empower peer leaders who can reach out and help others with similar life experiences." [www.okumc.org]

This Sunday Rev. Brantley Tillery will be sharing with us about Criminal Justice and Mercy Ministries [cjamm], Exodus House and Redemption Church. It is a place we can all be involved in as we go outside our walls and make disciples for the transformation of the world.

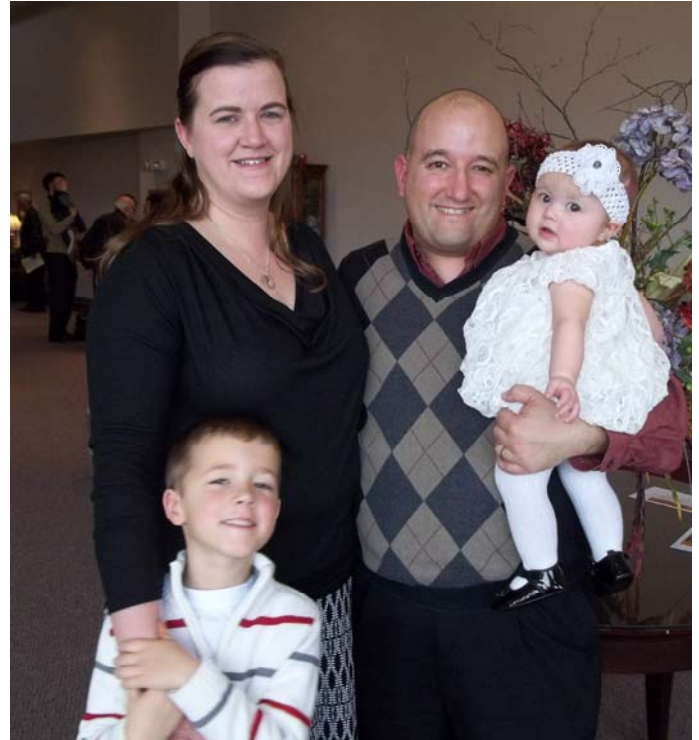

Response to: "What is the difference between praying to God and with God?"
Diane Stamm



I usually don't "Google" too many theological questions but I did this one and the overwhelming response was websites that pointed to: "praying TO God". This reference implies that praying is a one-way type conversation with one person talking and the other listening. I prefer to think of prayer being much more than a one-way street: me talking and God listening but no response (OR) God talking to me and I am not responding. Either way does not imply good communication nor a healthy relationship.

The other option to pray WITH God is much more agreeable to me because it implies communication going both ways between me and God. Prayer begins with relationship. That is because God created people to enjoy relating with them although we don't always enter into the full range of relationship He invites us into. Perhaps we limit ourselves to one or two relational aspects by seeing God as Ruler and ourselves as subjects or God as Master and ourselves as a servant. If that is the way you relate to God then your prayers will be TO God. However, if you relate to God as friend to friend you can enter into prayer WITH God. It may be helpful to consider a few of the many aspects of true friendship: doing things together; asking for input and advice; enjoying each other and trusting each other. Seeing God as Friend can be very comforting and help us to communicate WITH Him in the context of loving relationship.

A good book I recommend to study is: Prayer Begins with Relationship by Cynthia Hyle Bezek.

This course will discuss how to grow your own herbs both outdoors and indoors. Ideas for storing and using herbs will also be presented.

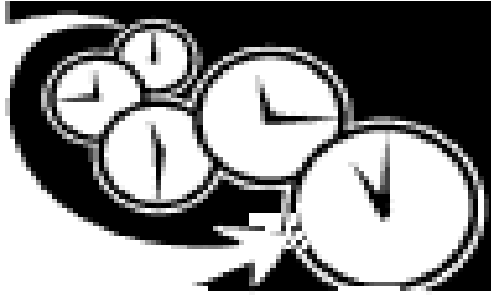

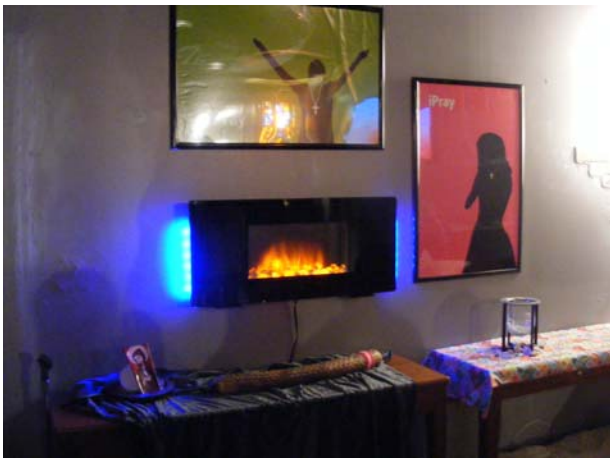

Costa Rica Mission Trips

Faith United Methodist Church is offering 2 trips this year Costa Rica – specifically, to Alejuela, (a suburb of San Jose, the capital city) in the central highlands - June 9th through 16th and July 28th through August 4th.

Room & Board is at El Centro Metodista, where the rooms are similar to dormitory rooms. Showers are hot and the food is tasty. The grounds are gated and include a chapel and swimming pool.

Work is going to be at the Center, doing some refurbishing, for the first group with trips to La Inglesia Evangelica Metodista Restauración for mission bible school and medical work. The second group will be doing construction work at La Inglesia Evangelica Metodista Restauración, running a mission bible school and doing eye examinations.

Tours will be on Sunday after church of downtown San Jose, and on Friday, we will take a site-seeing trip of lovely Costa Rica. In the past we have been to a volcano, rain forest, zoological park and coffee plantation.

Weather will be a bit cloudy with an afternoon shower. We are going to be there during the "wet" season with temperatures in the 70s and 80s and cooler in the evenings.

Money required for the trip is \$1,350, which covers all your costs from the time you leave Tulsa until you return (except for those priceless souvenirs). Please note that cost does not need to be a barrier. Contact the leaders for further details.

Anyone can go – youth and adults. There are no special skills needed, not even Spanish, as many Costa Ricans speak English and both your leaders speak Spanish. The only requirements are that you must have a passport, be flexible and have a desire to share Christ's love with your brothers and sisters in Costa Rica.

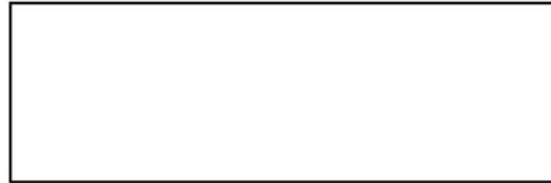
