# Letter from the Pastor

---



Dear Faith,

The month of May is bursting with special events that will take place during worship on Sundays. We will begin with our first Sunday as Senior Sunday on May 5. Our oldest youth will be leading worship and serving us as we celebrate this significant transition in their lives. It is also the first Sunday of the month and we will be offering Communion in both services.

On May 12 we will be celebrating Mother's Day by recognizing the characteristics of God that are maternal. I will be using feminine pronouns for the Holy One and we will be unpacking scripture that describes God in traditionally feminine ways.

Then, on May 19, we will celebrate the birth of the church on Pentecost Sunday. I understand that Tricia and Patty have planned something musically special for that day.

As you probably already know, the last Sunday of May is Memorial Sunday. This federal holiday recognizes and honors those who have served and lost their lives in military service. It has transitioned into remembering all those who have died by decorating their graves. This will be the first year that I will go to the cemetery in Okmulgee without my mom at my side as we remember and decorate the graves of our family members. Hopefully, my daughter will go with me and I will teach her where all of our people are buried. It is a humbling experience but it is also a remarkably happy time running into people that I haven't seen in a very long time at the cemetery.

On May 9, our worship and music team will be long-range planning for the rest of the year. If you have an idea that you would like us to consider for a sermon series or special worship service, please email me the details and we will add it to our brainstorm pile of things to consider. We often begin with questions about what is happening in the world and what things are on our people's minds.

We have noticed that July 4 is on a Thursday this year which means that most employers will be giving folks Friday off for a long weekend. We have decided to only offer one worship service on July 7. I am looking for four people to coordinate a pot luck luncheon for that day. If you can lead or help with that, please email me and I will get you started.

Thank you to everyone for all the prayers for my mother after her accident. She has moved to rehab now and we were told that it would be six months before she will feel normal. Right now, our prayer is that the arm heals naturally and that she won't need surgery. We also have many faithful members of our congregation recovering from falls, accidents and surgeries. Keep praying for each of these situations that they may be resolved and healing will be complete.

# TOWN HALL MEETING

## Meeting Recap from April 21

Over 60 people gathered in the Chapel on Sunday, April 21, to talk about Jesus-sized dreams for Faith United Methodist. Chair of the Leadership Team, Nikki Frasier, opened us by reading a devotion for that very day in the Upper Room about praying with childlike faith to ask God for big, bold things. Jesus-sized dreams are often thrilling and terrifying at the same time.

Pastor Heather shared some of the history of Faith and church planting. The Administrative Council at Faith had set a goal to plant a new church within a 5 year window. In 2013, Heather was chosen to be a church planter. The Cabinet reached out to the pastor at Faith at the time to see if they would partner with Heather, but they declined.

In 2022 at the Leadership Retreat for goal setting, the idea to plant something new bubbled up again from the people in the congregation. Pastor Heather said she was surprised, but decided that it was because Faith is such a wonderful church that the people who attend here wish more people had a church like theirs. She explained that the District Superintendent had asked us to consider shepherding the new church in Owasso.

April Sellers-White was present at the town hall and is a member of Faith coming to us from the Sapulpa church after they disaffiliated. She and Pastor Heather have known each other for

many years. She is a certified Lay Speaker and was asked to serve as the Pastor of the new church start in Owasso.

Heather explained the demographic information about Owasso and how their new church had started. They currently have 50-60 people meeting in a Middle School gymnasium. They had 85 people at their Easter service. This church wants to be their own church and not a satellite congregation. They are financially stable and have not received funds from the conference yet. They currently have funds from the District. Heather asked how many people wanted to help this new church get started, and almost everyone raised their hands in the affirmative.

Pastor Heather also shared the vision responses from the staff for their Jesus-sized dreams for Faith. One of these dreams was to start a Korean ministry, because the Tulsa Korean church had disaffiliated. Pastor Seungrok presented statistics for the area and the Korean population. The viability of this is still uncertain. Pastor Seungrok is praying and discussing this possibility. We did not vote on this idea because we did not want to put any pressure on Pastor Seungrok from the congregation.

We next discussed the possibility of a new church plant in Bixby. Some of our youth were present and contributed to the conversation. Bixby does not

have any Lutheran, Disciples or Presbyterian churches and the Methodist church disaffiliated. The projected growth for this area over the next 10 years is significant.

Discussion centered on doing something in Bixby that would be a satellite campus of Faith. Steven Spradling suggested doing some splash events and circuit riding in Bixby. He knows a lot of people in the area. A positive suggestion was to do some intentional marketing in the Bixby area to make folks aware of Faith. People affirmed using a marketing professional to help with this. There is almost \$300,000 in funds for starting something new from the conference if we wanted to move forward.

When Pastor Heather asked how many people were excited about doing something new, 50% were affirmative. Since it was the first time to hear any of these details, it was surprisingly positive.

For the next 90 days, we would like you to pray, discuss and let us know where you see God leading us. If you would like Pastor Heather to come talk to your group, please reach out to get on her schedule. We will schedule another Town Hall following the 90 days and the completion of General Conference to decide how to move forward.

## SHELF CARE BOOK CLUB


STARTS MAY 13, 6PM | BROKEN ARROW LIBRARY
